Blue Knot advocate for and provide support to people who have experiences of complex trauma, and those who support them, personally and professionally.

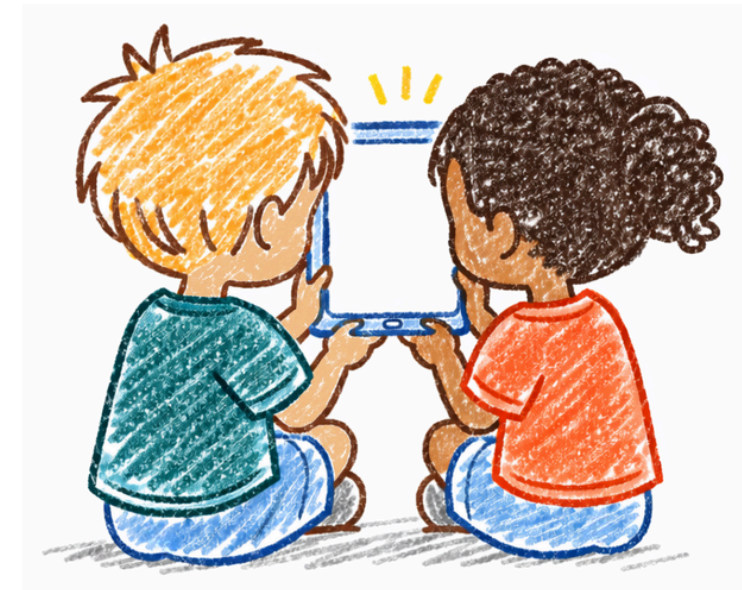

Helpful definitions

Child sexual exploitation and abuse (CSEA) –

Any act that exposes a child to, or involves a child in, unlawful or unacceptable sexual activities or interactions.

Online child sexual exploitation (OCSE) –

Child abuse or exploitation partly, or entirely, facilitated by technology or the internet.

Child sexual abuse material (CSAM) –

Any material that shows or describes child sexual abuse, including nude or sexual images of children (whether real, manipulated or AI-generated).

Grooming – Where an adult makes contact with a child to form a relationship for the purpose of enabling sexual abuse.

Sexual extortion – Online blackmail where an offender threatens to share sexual images unless a victim complies with demands.

Child sexual exploitation and abuse is affecting communities across Australia.

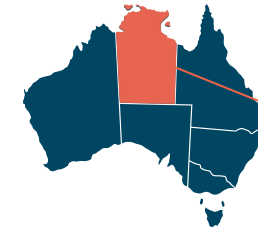
Children are experiencing increasing levels of harm online, with reports of online exploitation continuing to rise nationally.

Emerging technologies, including AI, are making it easier to create, manipulate and share abusive material, and to target and exploit children.

Clear and accessible information about where to find help is essential, so people can access support quickly when they need it most.

If you or someone you know has been harmed online, you may consider the following steps:

- 1 Collect evidence**
Take screenshots, record social media details and webpage addresses, note dates/times.
- 2 Report harm**
Speak to police, report to ACCCE, eSafety, or relevant state-based services.
- 3 Stop contact**
Stop all contact, block offenders, increase account privacy.
- 4 Find support**
Get images removed by Take It Down, and seek support from available services.
